The Associate in Arts for Transfer Degree in Political Science, also called the Political Science AA-T Degree, prepares students to transfer to CSU campuses that offer bachelor's degrees in Political Science. This degree requires students complete 60 CSU transferable units, including completion of CSU GE or IGETC and 18-19 units in the major with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better. Title 5 requires that students earn a grade of "C" or better in all major coursework.

Note: It is strongly recommended that students meet with a Fullerton College counselor to review the AA-T requirements.

To receive your AA-T degree, you will need to complete a Fullerton College graduation application and turn it in to Admissions and Records by the graduation application deadline.
