Social Justice Studies: General Associate in Arts Degree for Transfer prepares students to transfer to CSU and other college/university campuses that offers bachelor’s degrees in Social Justice Studies; Modern Jewish Studies; Sociology – Concentration in Critical Race Studies; Sociology – Concentration in Race, Class, and Gender; Sociology with Inequalities and Diversity Option; Social Science with Emphasis in Islamic and Arabic Studies. Social Justice Studies: General Associate in Arts Degree for Transfer allows students to gain knowledge and experience to work with culturally-diverse populations, and understand how social justice issues affect various communities. This degree requires students complete 60 CSU transferable units, including completion of CSU GE or IGETC and 18-20 units in the major with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better. Title 5 requires that students earn a grade of "C" or better in all major coursework.

Note: It is strongly recommended that students meet with a Fullerton College counselor to review the AA-T requirements.
