Social Justice Studies – Gender Studies Associate in Arts Degree for Transfer prepares students to transfer to CSU and other college/university campuses that offers bachelor’s degrees in Gender Studies; Sociology – Concentration Race, Class and Gender; Critical Race, Gender and Sexuality Studies; Women, Gender and Sexuality Studies; and Women’s Studies. Social Justice Studies – Gender Studies Associate in Arts Degree for Transfer allows students to gain knowledge and experience to work with culturally-diverse populations, and understand how social justice issues affect various communities. This degree requires students complete 60 CSU transferable units, including completion of CSU GE or IGETC and 18-20 units in the major with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better. Title 5 requires that students earn a grade of "C" or better in all major coursework.

**Note: It is strongly recommended that students meet with a Fullerton College counselor to review the AA-T requirements.**
