Social Work and Human Associate in Arts Degree for Transfer, also called the AA-T (ADT), prepares students to transfer to CSU campuses that offer bachelor’s degrees in Collaborative Health and Human Services, Criminal Justice, Human Services, Social Work, and Sociology. Through this program, students will gain knowledge of human service delivery systems, communication skills for working with individuals, groups and diverse populations, case management techniques, and will gain hands-on field experience in one or more human service agencies. This degree requires students complete 60 CSU transferable units, including completion of CSU GE or IGETC and 28-31 units in the major and electives with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better. Title 5 requires that students earn a grade of "C" or better in all major coursework.

Note: It is strongly recommended that students meet with a Fullerton College counselor to review the AA-T requirements.
