The Associate in Arts for Transfer Degree in Anthropology, also called the Anthropology AA-T Degree, prepares students to transfer to CSU campuses that offer bachelor's degrees in Anthropology. This degree requires students complete 60 CSU transferable units, including completion of CSU GE or IGETC and 19-20 units in the major with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better. Title 5 requires that students earn a grade of "C" or better in all major coursework.

**Note: It is strongly recommended that students meet with a Fullerton College counselor to review the AA-T requirements.**
