Child and Adolescent Development Associate in Arts Degree for Transfer, also called the AA-T (ADT), prepares students to transfer to CSU campuses that offer bachelor's degrees in Child and Adolescent Development. This degree requires students complete 60 CSU transferable units, including completion of CSU GE or IGETC and 27 units in the major and electives with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better. Title 5 requires that students earn a grade of "C" or better in all major coursework.

**Note: It is strongly recommended that students meet with a Fullerton College counselor to review the AA-T requirements.**
